- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA.
- Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.

This experience may be delayed or completed during a regular semester, if needed. Students may complete up to an additional 9 credit hours while completing HRTM 290.
- 6. HRSM Professional Electives are chosen in consultation with an advisor. At least 6 hours must be from HRTM.
- 7. The Tourism Management major curriculum includes 3-11 hours of approved electives, depending on how students fulfill the Carolina Core requirements. Any course in the University can be used to satisfy the elective requirement including additional electives in the major.
- 8. Structured industry practical experience in a hospitality or tourism company. 400 hours required. Students may complete up to an additional 9 credit hours while completing HRTM 495.

Program Notes:

- Minors are optional for Tourism Management majors and may be in any course of study offered by the College of HRSM as well as any other University program with an approved minor. College of HRSM required courses may not be counted toward a minor.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
