- 8. A student majoring in Information Science has the option of completing a specified minor sequence of courses prescribed by the unit offering the minor (see Complementary Programs on the Bulletin) or selecting an additional 18 hours of elective courses, as approved by the advisor. General Education requirement courses do not count as electives or toward the minor.
- SAEL 200 is approved to fulfill the CC-CMS and VSR requirements and is recommended for Information Science majors. If SPCH 140 or 260 is used to
 fulfill the CC-CMS requirement, then a separate CC-VSR course will be required. SPCH 140 and 260 cannot be used to fulfill both the CC-CMS
 requirement and the SLIS public speaking requirement.

Program Notes:

- Courses identified as "critical" form a foundation for and enhance understanding of subsequent major courses.
- Admission to the upper division is based upon a minimum 2.50 cumulative USC GPA; completion of SLIS 201 and SLIS 202 with grades of C or higher; completion of 60 or more semester hours toward the degree; completion of most content preparation requirements; selection of a particular program of study within the college; and selection and approval of a minor. All students desiring to be admitted to the upper division must formally apply for admission some time after completion of 45 semester hours and SLIS 201 and SLIS 202 and before completion of more than 75 hours of University course work.
- No Information Science course may be repeated more than once by any student.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
