## Program of Study

## Degree Requirements (120 hours)

1. Carolina Core ( $\mathbf{3} 2-44$ hours)
a. CMW (6 hours): any approved CC-CMW course -must be passed with a grade of $C$ or bigher © completed in the first 60 bours
b. ARP (6-8 hours)
i. MATH 122 or MATH 141
ii. STAT 201 or 205 (Students may also take STAT 509 or 515 to fulfill the statistics requirement, but would be required to complete an approved Carolina Core ARP course to fulfill the second ARP requirement)
c. SCI (8 hours)
i. BIOL 101/101L and BIOL 102/102L
or
ii. MSCI 101 and MSCI 102
d. GFL (0-6 hours): Demonstration of proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the minimal passing grade on the exit examination in the 122 course is required for all baccalaureate degrees. Students can demonstrate this proficiency by successfully completing Phase II of the Proficiency Test or by successfully completing the 122 course, including the exit exam administered as part of that course.
It is strongly recommended that students continuing the study of a foreign language begin college-level study of that language in their first semester and continue in that language until their particular foreign language requirement is completed.

i. POLI 201
g. AIU (3 hours): any approved CC-AIU course

## Carolina Core Stand Alone or Overlay Eligible Requirements:

Up to two of these requirements may be met in overlay courses. At least one of these requirements must be satisfied by a course not applied elsewhere in general education. (3-9 Hours)

Electives (13-30 hours) (to reach required bours to graduate): No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit toward degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences. The College of Arts and Sciences allows the use of the Pass-Fail option on elective courses. Further clarification on inapplicable courses can be obtained from the College of Arts and Sciences.
5. Major Requirements (36-37 hours): All majors must complete at least 36-37 hours of approved courses, including the core requirements of 27 hours. Majors must complete enough additional hours from the selected courses to bring them to the required 36-37 hours total. Students are required to develop a program of study in consultation with their advisor. A minimum grade of C is required for all courses used to fulfill major requirements.
