Program of Study

Degree Requirements (128 hours)

- 1. Carolina Core (31-43 hours)
 - a. **CMW** (6 hours) –must be passed with a grade of C or higher
 - i. ENGL 101 Critical Reading and Composition
 - ii. ENGL 102 Rhetoric and Composition
 - b. ARP (6-8 hours): any approved CC-ARP course
 - c. SCI (7 hours): Two CC-SCI courses, including one 4-credit hour laboratory science
 - d. **GFL** (0-6 hours): Demonstration of proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the minimal passing grade on the exit examination in the 122 course.

Note: Foreign language requirement is satisfied through successful completion of FREN 122, GERM 122, ITAL 122 with a grade of B or higher.

- e. **GHS** (3 hours): any approved CC-GHS course
- f. **GSS** (3 hours): any approved CC-GSS course
- g. AIU (3 hours): Course(s) must be taken in a department other than Music

Carolina Core Stand Alone or Overlay Eligible Requirements:

Up to two of these requirements may be met in overlay courses. At least one of these requirements must be satisfied by a course not applied elsewhere in general education. (3-9 Hours)

- h. CMS (0-3 hours): any approved overlay or stand-alone CC-CMS course
- i. INF (0-3 hours): any approved overlay or stand-alone CC-INF course
- j. VSR (0-3 hours): any approved overlay or stand-alone CC-VSR course
- 2. College Requirements: None required by the School of Music
- 3. Program Requirements (0-7 hours)
 - a. Foreign language course (0-3 hours) –only if needed to meet 122-level proficiency
 - b. Electives (0-7 hours): No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit toward degrees in the School of Music. The School of Music allows the use of the Pass-Fail option on elective courses. Further clarification on inapplicable courses can be obtained from the School of Music.

- b. Concentration: Performance (62 hours)
 - i. MUSC 518 Form and Analysis or MUSC 525 Post-Tonal Music Theory
 - ii. **Theory, History, and Literature Electives** (6 hours): Students must complete the literature course(s) in applied area when available. Courses include: MUSC 523, 526, 528, 544, 555, 557, 560, 561, 562, 563, and 564
 - iii. **Applied Music Courses** (32 hours): Applied Music must be completed satisfactorily for a minimum of 8 semesters & 32 hours of credit.
 - 1. MUSC 211 Lower Division Applied Music-Performance Track (16 hours)
 - 2. MUSC 411 Upper Division Applied Music–Performance Track (16 hours)
 - iv. Ensembles (8 hours): Students are required to participate in the major ensemble most closely related to their primary instrument. Students must declare a primary instrument upon acceptance into the program. Some ensembles require an audition for membership. Regulations for attendance at ensemble rehearsals & performances are different from regulations for class attendance. Members of ensembles are expected to be present at every rehearsal & performance, unless excused by the conductor. Courses which qualify for the Chamber Music requirement include all MUSC 130 courses with a suffix of A-Z and topics in: Voice, String, Percussion, Wind, Guitar, and Keyboard. Ensemble requirements are:
 - Guitar: 2 major (usually choral), 6 guitar ensembles
 - Jazz: 6 jazz ensembles, 2 major or minor jazz ensembles
 - Organ: 4 major (usually choral), 4 accompanying
 - Piano: 2 major, 2 accompanying, 2 chamber, 2 of choice
 - String: 6 orchestra, 2 chamber
 - Voice: 6 major, 2 opera workshop
 - Wind/Percussion: 6 major, 2 chamber
 - v. Concentration Electives (13 hours): Students must complete a minimum of 13 hours of music major electives, including MUED 155 & 156, if needed. Students whose primary medium is voice must complete MUSC 278, MUSC 578, and MUSC 579. Students must complete a pedagogy course in applied area when available. For Bachelor of Music candidates with an emphasis in performance, a half recital is required in the junior year & a full recital is required in the senior year, as well as selection of one of following options with its required electives:
