**Prior to Admission**

An Associate’s Degree in Nursing or Diploma in Nursing from an accredited ACEN (formerly NLNAC) program and a current unrestricted Registered Nurse (R.N.) license to practice professional nursing in the United States are required for admission to the RN-BSN program. A minimum LIFE GPA of 3.000 average on all pre- or co-requisite courses and on all required nursing courses for the Associate Degree in Nursing are required. See the Bulletin for additional admissions requirements.

Prior to admission into (or while pursuing) the R.N.-B.S.N., students must have credit for all Carolina Core<sup>1</sup> requirements plus electives including the equivalents of:

- Two levels of statistics *or* one course in statistics and one course calculus
- Microbiology with laboratory
- Human Growth and Development
- Anatomy and Physiology I and II with laboratories
- Introduction to Psychology *and* Introductory Sociology

The RN-BSN Program is a distance education program with online coursework, offered in 7-week courses.

1. The [Carolina Core](#) provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students. Students in the College of Nursing are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language by a score of 2 or higher on the foreign language placement test, or credit equivalent to USC 109 and 110 courses, or credit equivalent to the USC 121 course.
2. Regardless of individual course grades, students admitted to the RN-BSN Program must maintain a minimum 3.000 cumulative LIFE and Institutional GPA to maintain good standing in the program.
3. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
4. No elective courses of a remedial and developmental nature may apply as credit toward the 120 hours minimum.
5. Requires 8 hours of work per week in the community.
6. After admission to the RN BSN program and completion of all BSN degree requirements: Students awarded an Associate Degree in Nursing from an accredited (ACEN, formerly NLNAC) program will be awarded up to 38 credits towards meeting educational competencies for their A.D.N. degree (RN Licensure); OR Students with a Diploma in Nursing from an accredited (ACEN, formerly NLNAC) program will be awarded up to 25 credits towards meeting educational competencies for their Diploma degree (RN Licensure). This credit is held and will be awarded upon successful completion of all BSN degree requirements.

### Program Notes:

- Courses identified as “critical” must be completed in the semester in which they are listed.
- Students must maintain RN licensure for the duration of the RN-BSN Program.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina.
