Program of Study

Degree Requirements (122 hours)

- 1. Carolina Core (31-43 hours)
 - a. **CMW** (6 hours): any approved CC-CMW course —must be passed with a grade of C or higher
 - b. **ARP** (6-7 hours):
 - i. STAT 201 Elementary Statistics
 - ii. One of the following options:
 - 1. MATH 122 Calculus for Business Administration and Social Sciences
 - 2. MATH 141 Calculus I
 - 3. Any other STAT course approved for Carolina Core ARP
 - c. SCI (7 hours): Two approved CC-SCI courses, including a least one with a laboratory selected from Biology
 - d. **GFL** (0-6 hours): A score of two or better on the foreign language placement test or equivalent Carolina Core GFL course(s)
 - e. **GHS** (3 hours): any approved CC-GHS course
 - f. **GSS** (3 hours): any approved CC-GSS course from Psychology (PSYC) or Sociology (SOCY)
 - g. AIU (3 hours): any approved CC-AIU course

Carolina Core Stand Alone or Overlay Eligible Requirements:

The combined CMS, INF, and VSR requirements must include at least three hours not being used to satisfy Carolina Core requirements outside those three areas. (3-9 Hours)

- h. CMS (3 hours): any approved overlay or stand-alone CC-CMS course
- i. **INF** (0-3 hours): any approved overlay or stand-alone CC-INF course
- j. VSR (3 hours): any approved overlay or stand-alone CC-VSR course

2. College Requirements (6-18 hours)

- a. **History** (3 hours): The College of Social Work requires two 100-level history courses, at least one of which must be U.S. History (HIST 111 or 112). Whichever is not fulfilled through the Carolina Core GHS requirement must be fulfilled through this college requirement.
- b. One economics course (3 hours)
- c. These requirements may be satisfied as part of the Carolina Core requirements (12 hours):
 - i. POLI 201 American National Government
 - ii. One 200-level and above literature course selected from a list of approved courses (see advisor for details)
 - iii. One philosophy course
 - iv. One cultural awareness course (A wide variety of courses can be considered under the general category of "cultural awareness." Students are to consult with their advisors for approved courses.)

3. Program Requirements (1-25 hours)

a. **Electives** (1-25 hours): The BSW requires a minimum of 62 semester hours in academic subjects for the Carolina Core and College Requirements. Students with fewer than 62 hours in Carolina Core and College Requirements must take enough electives to fulfill the 122 hour minimum. No elective courses of a remedial and developmental nature may apply as credit toward the 122 hour minimum.
